Titanic****PSHE:**

Our focus this term is on how to handle various situations out of school. We will be addressing e-safety and cyber bullying and discussing the impact of social media. We will also deal with how our behaviour can impact on someone else's behaviour and what antisocial behaviour is.

**Maths:**

- Y6: Constructing line graphs, Finding the range, mean, mode and median, length word problems, converting measures between imperial and metric, area and perimeter of irregular shapes, problem solving with measures, dividing by decimals and simplifying fractions.
- Y5: drawing graphs, solving length word problems, 12/24 clock, calendars, co-ordinates, multiplying two digits by two digits, knowing what a factor and multiple are, how can I solve missing number problems? Problems involving fractions, fractions of amounts and writing a fraction as a decimal.
