

Geography

Following a route around the world, children will study geographical features of a variety of countries around the world. They will immerse themselves in a range of cultures and compare traditions and lifestyles. Children will develop their map skills, and be able to identify the continents and name and locate different countries; and go on to map Mr. Fogg's journey around the World.

Literacy

In this unit children will explore how authors create mystery stories. They use similar techniques to write their own dramatic and compelling mystery story.

Non-Fiction: Children's understanding of non-chronological reports is developed in their week. They will identify key features of this text type and, with support, write their own non-chronological report about space.

Spelling: Endings which sound like spelt -tion, -sion, -ssion, -cian /jən/, Prefix il, im, ir
Grammar: Adverbs and word families. Sentences, Perfect tense.

Religious Education


What do stories and images of deities tell us about Hindu beliefs?

Be able to describe some of the key feature of some Hindu Festivals such as Divali and Holi. They can make links between Hindu beliefs and practice and Hindu stories. They can identify the impact of the Hindu tradition on Hindu lifestyle. Understand symbolism in the Hindu faith. They can make links between their own values and what they do.

Mathematics (Mrs Holt)

Y3: Adding and subtractions fractions with same denominator within 1, reading bar charts, feeling confident with telling the time in both digital and analogue, recognising turns as fractions.

Y4: Adding and subtractions fractions with same denominator beyond 1, comparing and ordering fractions with different denominators, reading timetables, convert time from 24 hour to analogue, again recapping time making sure all children are confident and able to tell the time

Computing

Children will learn about networks, including the internet. They will learn about encryption and consider implications of privacy. They will be made aware of the importance of DNS and learn how to use command line diagnostic tools safely.
