

Topic

A geographical focus on Africa. Looking at the lay of the land, rivers and countries. How is Africa composed?

Looking at the animals that live there. What is it like on Safari. Thinking about the morality of hunting and how poaching impacts the animals.

What is life like for a typical child in Africa. Is poverty spread across the country? What can we do to make their lives different? The River Nile as the life blood of Africa.

Literacy

Inference and deduction skills. Building cohesive paragraphs, nouns and pronouns, standard English. Spelling rules. Plurals, possession and apostrophes.

In this unit children will explore a playscript set in Vietnam. They will look at the differences in how the characters see themselves and how others see them. The children will write a playscript based on the traditional tale of Rumpelstiltskin.

Children will look at evidence in non-fiction writing. They will evaluate and present details to a "court."

Looking at a story set in Victorian times children will look at stories with a historical setting. They will think about a historical setting for their own writing. Children will use this writing to explore journalistic texts.

Mathematics (Mrs Holt)

Time: how long until o'clock, reading quarter past and quarter to on a digital clock, telling the time to the nearest minute, understand am and pm, how many days in each month and a leap year, read 24 hour clock, convert analogue to digital time. Roman numerals-telling the time using Roman numerals, solve addition and subtraction sums using fractions, increase measures by a given proportion, use a 2 step number machine and solving word problems.

Year 4:

Draw a shape using co-ordinates, describe the pattern of co-ordinates, converting ml to l, calculating time gaps within an hour, across an hour, across several hours, reading Roman numerals to 100, sorting polygons, multiplying fractions beyond 1, algebra and using multi step function machines.
